English

Write a story about a fantasy world, like in our English lessons.

- Interview a family member about their journey to the UK, recording Q&As.
- Collect instruction leaflets for our instructions leaflet after half term.
- Read a book, design a new front cover/draw the setting and write a book review.
- Learn a poem and recite it by heart.
- Write a poem about our theme

- Learn your number bonds / times tables and division facts
- Sequence numbers to 20
- Draw 2D shapes and then find half and a quarter of them.
- Learn quarter past, half past, quarter to and hour time.
- Add a one digit and two digit number. i.e $24+3=$
- Subtract a one digit number from a two digit number. i.e $20-3=$

Homework

Creative / Practical

- Bake with a family member.
- Learn a new skill: sewing, knitting, being a mechanic, decorating etc..
- Learn / practice first aid and CPR.
- Go on a walk and collect objects of interest / photos/ write about where you went and what you saw.
- Watch Newsround and summarise stories including the headlines.
- Prepare a show and tell about something you are interested in.
