Pupils are expected to read for 15 minutes every day and practice their phonics / spellings and times tables every day as well as choosing activities from the selection below. Try to ensure you do a balance of different activities each day / week. Work (which can include photographs / evidence of activities or visits etc.) should be recorded in this Learning at Home book to share when school re-opens.



English

Write a story about a poor Victorian child, like in our English lessons.

- Interview a family member about their journey to the UK, recording Q&As.
- Make table listing adjectives, nouns and verbs that you can identify in your house.
- Read a book, design a new front cover/draw the setting and write a book review.
- Write a letter to Oliver Twist, Fagin or Bill
 Sikes
- Write a diary entry from the point of view of someone in a workhouse

Maths



- Learn your times tables and division tack
- Create money word problems and write model answers (total up items from your shopping list)
- Create a tally chart of how many different types of food you have in your kitchen – see if you can turn it into a bar graph!
- Teach a younger brother or sister column addition and column subtraction
- Measure the perimeter (the outside) of large objects such as tables, TVs and laptops.

- Bake with a family member.
- Learn a new skill: sewing, knitting, being a mechanic, decorating etc..
- Learn / practice first aid and CPR.
- Go on a walk and collect objects of interest / photos/ write about where you went and what you saw.
