English

- Write a poem about the conditions in a Victorian workhouse.
- Debate with your parents/siblings whether or not children should be allowed to get arrested at 10 years old? Do you think this is fair? Explain why.
- Create a Venn diagram to compare punishments for Victorian children to punishments for children today.
- Do you find any of the school rules unfair? Write a letter to your teacher giving reasons for why it is unfair. Can you suggest better rules?
