Autumn half term is a 7 week half term and our words for this half term are:

Our whole school theme for this half term is:

Clear, concise and coherent curriculum.



In our English lessons, we will be exploring a fiction text 'Railway Children.' We will be reading the text and answering retrieval and inference questions. We will be learning how to identify and use grammatical devices in our writing and produce a diary in role as one of the characters and we will be writing our own narrative.

We will be learning to read, recite and perform poems. We will be looking in detail at the poem and creating our own poem tied into our experiences about what we can see from a railway carriage.

Guided Reading



The Bronte sisters have created a poem "Lines Composed in a Wood on a Windy Day" We will be learning to read, recite and perform poems and in effect we will be writing poems about our experiences. We will be retrieving

information from a non-fiction text and learning about the Bronte sisters and their life. We will be writing a non-chronological report about the key events that happened.

of topic for Maths we will be learning to our number and place value facts so

that we are able to solve number and practical problems which involve money and measures. Throughout the lessons, we will be working on real life problems.

Reading

This half term we will focus on reading fluency and the use of expression and intonation when reading. We will experience reading as a whole class, as part of a group and individually. We will send reading books home each week. Please return these every Monday so that your child can take a new book home.





Geography



In our Geography lessons, we will be looking at maps of Keighley and Haworth and answer questions. We will also be learning how to use ordnance survey symbols and 6 future grid references. In order to find out more about our locality, we will be analysing maps, aerial photographs, plans and e-resources.

History



As historians, we will be learning about significant people from Keighley and discuss reasons why these people have made a difference and the impact they have had on our lives today. We will place features of historical events and people from the past societies and periods in a chronological framework so we can build up a timeline of our local history.

PHSCE



Me, Myself and Relationships

Our theme this half term for PSHCE is all about Me, myself and relationships where we will be learning about our identity and relationships we have with others. We will be reflecting on a challenges we might face that arise from friendships and lean how to deal with these. We will also be learning to keep personal information safe online.

Art



As part of our Art lessons, we will be creating mood landscapes and using art to express emotions through the use of colour, lines and shading. We will also be planning and designing a sculpture (using a range of different techniques, tools and materials) inspired by Craig Dyson.

Science





The Human Body: Finger on the Pulse

In our Science lessons we will be identifying and naming the main parts of the human circulatory system. We will be able to describe the function of the heart, blood vessels and blood. As part of our lessons we will be exploring the impact diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle can have on our health. We will also be describing the ways in which nutrients and water are transported in animals, including humans

<u>Times tables</u>: By the end of year four children are expected to be able to recall all of the multiplication and division facts up to 12x. Regular practise of these is vital for your child to become secure with these facts. Please help your child to say and use their times tables.

Talking at Home

We encourage you to talk to your child about their learning in class. Ask them what they have learnt each day or something new which they have found out. See if your child can explain what they have been learning at school. This is a good indication of how well they listen and how interested they are in their work. They may even tell you something you didn't know!

Spellings

Children will be given a list of spellings every Friday. Please help your child to read and spell these correctly as they will be tested on these in class.
