THE SCHOOL DAY

Please can we remind all parents that lessons start at 8:45am so your child needs to be at school just BEFORE this time. We have a number of pupils who are regularly late. Being just 10 minutes late per day means almost an hour of lost learning time every week, totalling over a full week if this continues through a school year. Please also note that lesson time finishes at 3:15pm and pupils are dismissed after this time not by this time. Thank you.

MEDICATION IN SCHOOL

Please can all parents and carers check the dates of medication kept in school (inhalers, Epipens etc...) and replace it when they are out of date. Any medication brought into school for other reasons (colds, coughs, travel sickness etc...) must also be handed to a member of staff and not left in children's coats, bags or pockets please.
