 - Try and choose a different type of homework each week - variety is important.
 - The suggestions below are based on the content of the curriculum. You can do anything as long as it is relevant to something we are learning about.

English

- Produce a book review about your class or library book – use the structure from your green review book to help.
- Using the spelling list in your Reading Record, choose between 5 and 10 words and write a sentence including each spelling.
- Write a story about a subject of your own choice – remember to include Year 5 punctuation and grammar features such as fronted adverbials, parenthesis, expanded noun phrases etc.
- Write a setting description for our trip to Malham.

Maths

- Write the date every day in Roman numerals.
- Create a board game (Monopoly, Snakes & Ladders) and include addition and subtraction questions.
- Buy 1 Get 3 Free! (Multiplication & Division Facts – inverse operation)
- Explain how to add/ subtract numbers beyond 5 digits.
- Make a collection of all the numbers you can find around your house – look in the kitchen, bedroom and bathroom.
- How many right angles can you find in your bedroom – count them and make a list of where they are.



Homework

Imagine you have a cardboard tube, some sticky tape, some string, and some magnets. What could you invent?

- Create a pencil drawing of a building you know – it could be your house or a building you can see from your bedroom window
- Bake a cake or some buns as a treat your family. Remember to take photographs of your finished product.

- Learn a new song to perform in front of an audience.
