Our theme for this half term is: Our Town Through Time

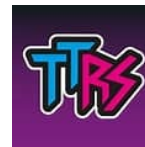
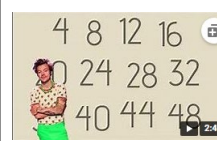
All of the homework options below are linked to either this theme or other learning from this term such as English / Maths / Science etc. Pupils are expected to **read** for 30 minutes every day and practice their **phonics / spellings and times tables** every day as well in addition to choosing 1 or 2 things from the options below each week. Try to ensure you do a balance of different activities over the half term, for example maths one week, creative the next etc. Work (which can include photographs / evidence of activities or visits etc..) should be recorded in this Learning at Home book (unless it is a model).

English



- Create your own diary about your weekend. What did you do? Who did you see? How did you feel? Include small pictures or illustrations.
- Write a book review. It could be your favourite book, one you have read recently, or the book in your book bag. What do you like about it or dislike about it? Summarise what happens in your favourite part? Who are the main characters, what do they do and why?

Maths



- Keep practicing your times tables (2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 10). Use "Hit the Button" on Top Marks Maths website if you want to play online.
- Watch times tables songs on Youtube to help you practice.
- Practise 100 more and 100 less than a number.
- Log in to TT Rock Stars every week to practise your times tables.

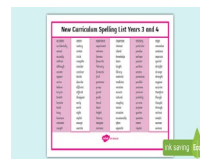


Creative



- Imagine that you have to leave your home at short notice. Draw the things you would pack in our suitcase (or make a junk model of your suitcase and it's contents.)
- Create a poppy or poppy wreath from recycled materials.
- Make a poster encouraging people to visit Keighley. Why should people visit Keighley? Why is Keighley a great place to visit and what can you do here?
- Design a welcome banner or poster to welcome a new person to our class. Make them feel welcome and reassured about joining our new class. What can you say to them so they will feel cared for and to make them feel at home?

Other



- Know your Year 3 spellings and create sentences using these.
- Walk around Keighley, what is the same now as it would have been 100 years ago? What would Keighley have looked like and how has it changed?
- Research one of the buildings we looked at on our walk. You can present your work as a report, poster, or even a news report (video)
- Keep a log table of your emotions this week. How do you feel? What has made you feel this way? Create your own images to show good / bad feelings.
