



- Your child is expected to complete at least one quality piece of homework per week - this should take about **15mins per day**.
- They should also **read daily**, and **practice their times tables / spellings**
- Each week your child should complete a **full page** in this book.
- If the homework is making a model / not written work, the child should write up what they did in this book, and include photos or a diagram (with labels).
- Try and choose a different type of homework each week - variety is important.
- The suggestions below are based on the content of the curriculum. You can do **anything** as long as it is relevant to something we are learning about.
- Please remember to take care and have pride in your presentation. 😊



English

Use the internet or reference books to research a mountain from around the world. Create a fact file about the mountain – include statistics, pictures, important news events, or quotes from explorers.

- Create a poem about a mountain atmosphere
- Produce a book review about your class or library book – use the structure from the classroom reading areas to help.
- Using the spelling list in your Reading Record, choose between 5 and 10 words and write a sentence including each spelling.
- Cursive handwriting practice on lined paper



Creative

Take your pencil for a walk – smooth or spiky edges. Colour in the gaps with different pencil shading styles or coloured pencil patterns.

- Sketch a detailed portrait of someone in your family – head and shoulders only.
- Make a model using plastic and cardboard from the recycle bin at home – only clean rubbish allowed.
- Create your own art masterpiece – choose a painting by LS Lowry or Henri Rousseau for inspiration.
- Re-write the lyrics of a favourite song
- Design and create a musical instrument to create a mountainous atmosphere



Maths

- Using the ages of all the people in your family create your own multiplication calculations.
- Buy 1 Get 3 Free! (Multiplication & Division Facts – inverse operation)
- Write out all the Prime numbers you know. Can you identify any patterns?
- Choose the times tables that you need to practice the most. Find the common multiples that appear in all of them.
- Add up the number of minutes that you spend completing homework in a week. Multiply by the number of weeks in a year
