



Please find below some suggestions as to learning activities your child could be doing at home during this period of Government enforced school closure. This menu of activities is additional to the theme menus sent home at the beginning of term, which pupils can continue working on as well. **Pupils are expected to read for 15 minutes every day and practice their phonics / spellings and times tables every day as well as choosing activities from the selection below.** Try to ensure you do a balance of different activities each day / week. Work (which can include photographs / evidence of activities or visits etc.) should be recorded in this Learning at Home book to share when school re-opens.

English

- Read Boy 87 and create a book review.
- Write a summary for Boy 87 using a storyboard.
- Create an alternative front cover for Boy 87.
- Write a farewell speech about your experience at Eastwood.
- Write a letter to your teachers sharing your memories of your time at Eastwood Community School.
- Create a postcard from somewhere you would like to visit in the holidays.
- Create a short story about a summer holiday adventure.
- Write a letter to your new secondary school teacher telling them all about you.

Maths

- Learn how to play a new game (e.g. chess/draughts).
- Find the total cost of buying your new uniform and equipment for secondary school.
- Research how to calculate the area of a triangle, parallelogram and composite shapes.
- Complete 3 Sudoku's which increase in difficulty.
- Learn Roman numerals up to 1,000.
- Create a maths poster for a Y5 pupil.
- Create an arithmetic quiz for a friend.
- Make a vocabulary mat using mathematical words.
- Create a BODMAS poster with examples.
- Create a revision guide for adding, subtracting, dividing and multiplying fractions.



Homework

Creative / Practical

- Design a poster to show how you would like to be remembered
- Create a piece of artwork to show your feelings about leaving and moving on to secondary school.
- Create a storyboard recording your favourite memory from each year group.
- Create a Venn diagram to show the similarities and differences between daily routines for primary and secondary school.
- Create a list of all the things you will need for secondary school.
- Plan and design an event to raise money for a charity.
- Walk for 1 hour outside every day for a week recording what you see on your journey.
- Learn how to cook a new recipe for your family.
