Go on a shape hunt in and outside of your house. What 2D and 3D shapes can you find? Can you identify and name these correctly?

Ask a grown up to let you use real coins. Make amounts to 5p. 10p, 15p and 20p. Take photographs or draw pictures in your home learning record to show the amounts you have made.

Build a cottage in the woods using different materials that you can find in your house such as cardboard tubes, boxes plastic containers. Take a picture to show how you have made it.
