HOLIDAYS

School closes for the final time this academic year to all students at lunchtime on Friday 23rd July. We will then be closed for the summer holidays. We will reopen to staff on Monday 6th and Tuesday 7th September for training. School will reopen for pupils on Wednesday 8th September and expect all pupils to be back in school on this date. Given the significant amount of time off our pupils have had this year and the continuing restrictions around foreign travel, we are not expecting families will be planning on taking extended leave during term time. As you are all aware, all Keighley and Bradford schools operate the same policy where holidays in term time are not authorized except in emergency circumstances and where proof of the reason for travel can be provided. Should you find yourself in such a situation, please remember to request a leave of absence request form before you need to travel.

OLD / OUTGROWN UNIFORMS
