<u>English</u>

Go on a sound hunt. (Find objects starting with the weekly phonics sounds) Can you remember the letter name that goes with the sound? (ng, ai, ee, igh, oa, oo) Learn to read the tricky words (be, was, my, you, her, they, all, are, some, said, come, do, so) Now can you spell them? Can you make your own treasure map? Visit Keighley Library and see if you can find a fiction and non-fiction book about pirates.



Creative

Listen to lots of different types of music. Which one is your favourite? Can you draw a picture of how it makes you feel?

Can you make a seaside picture? See if you can paint the sea in the backgraound and then add the fish, people and other animals at the front.

Can you go to Cliffe Castle and make sandcastles? You could try and steer the pirate ship too!





How manty different ways can you make 10? 6+4, 5+5. Can you show this in different ways e.g. with sticks, drawing pirate coins? Have a go at writing the number sentences to go with them too. Can you see any 3D shapes around you? Can you take some photos of them or make some models with them?

You could try and make some pirate accessories with them e.g. a telescope or even a pirate ship! Can you create some repeating patterns? For example red button blue button red button blue button. You could use shapes too

You could use paint, stampers, national equations such as leaves or sticks or draw them in your home learning book.
