Our theme for this half term is:

"Once upon a time and long, long ago".

This half term we will be learning all about "traditional tales" Our first book is Little Red Riding Hood.

All of the homework options below are linked to either this theme or other learning from this term such as English / Maths / Science etc.... Pupils are expected to **read** for 15 minutes every day and practice their **phonics / spellings and times tables** every day as well, in addition to choosing 1 thing from the options below each week. Try to ensure you do a balance of different activities over the half term, for example Maths one week, creative the next etc... Work (which can include photographs / evidence of activities or visits etc..) should be recorded in this Learning at Home book (unless it is a model).



English

Read a range of traditional tales eg Little Red Riding Hood, Goldilocks, The three billy goats gruff. Write about your favourite story? What did you like? Make a comparison to another traditional tale which you didn't like as much

Write different questions, using a question mark that you could write to one of the characters in a traditional tale.

Write a letter to one of your favourite characters in a tradiytional tale. What would you like them to know about you?

Write a list of all your favourite foods you like to taste. Write a list of all the foods you don't like.

<u>Creative</u>

Visit a museum such as Cliffe Castle or Salts Mill in Saltaire. take photographs of different artists work. How does each of the paintings make you feel?

Design Little Red Riding Hoods wood, out of any "junk materials" you have at home. You could use tubes, paint, paper etc.

Draw one of the characters from one of your favourite traditional tale. Use only pencils. Look carefully at the picture to make the characters features as life like as possible

Design and create a bridge for the three billy goats gruff. What could you make the bridge out of? Be as imaginative as you can. You could make int out of rolled up newspapers, cans etc. take a photograph to show



Make a clock face out of a circular piece of paper/ card/ the back of a cereal box. Write the numbers in the correct place on the clock.

Maths

Learn to read the time to the o`clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to the hour.

Practice counting in 2s. Learn your 10- and 5-times table.

Learn to halve and quarter shapes this could be anything eg pizza.

Halve and quarter amounts buy sweets. Count the sweets and then halve them. How many did you have? Now divide into quarters. How many did you get?

Follow a recipe to make some cakes or biscuits for a member for your family

Go on a "sense walk" with your family. Write a list of everything you could see or hear.

Visit a local wood, you could visit St. Ives, Myrtle Park or Cliffe Castle. Take photographs of the first signs of spring.

Look around your house/ grandparent's house. Make a list of all the new/ modern furniture or utensils you have. Can you find anything old? Do you know what they are and what they were used? Take photographs
