- Design a house using the appropriate materials so that it is able to survive the Great fire of London.
- After the Great Fire, King Charles II asked for a new map of London to be drawn. Draw a map of your neighbourhood or somewhere you know well. Remember to include important buildings and label
- Be an artist! Lots of people recorded the events of the fire in different ways. Many artists chose to show the view of the fire raging from across the River Thames. Create your own artwork.
- Draw or build a modern house and a house from 1666. What are the similarities and differences?

- Learn your 2, 5 and 10 times tables.

Practice writing 2 digit numbers and show what the value of each column is.

For this game, you will need to: Make your own $0-20\ \text{or}\ 0$ - $30\ \text{number}$ line.



Find a counter or small object and a dice. The rules: Player 1 is +, player 2 is + moves forwards on the numberline, - moves
