Write a limerick in the style of Edward Lear.

Learn by heart the Lewis Carroll poem "How doth the little crocodile" written in 1865.

- Design a book jacket for "Oliver Twist".
- Research and write a biography of Charles Dickens.
- Write a report on a Victorian inventor e.g.: George Stephenson, Thomas Twyford, Isambard Kingdom Brunel or another famous Victorian e.g.: Florence Nightingale.



Maths

- Find out about Victorian money – coins and notes.
- Can you add Victorian money?
- Draw a plan of Victoria Park. Calculate its area and perimeter.
- Find buildings with Roman Numerals
 1. Work out the year and how building is. Write your answer in Numerals.



Creative

- Make a model of a steam train.
- Draw and label a picture of a Victorian invention e.g.: a telephone, a penny farthing.
- Make a drawing of Victoria Hall (formerly Eastwood House) and find five facts about Eastwood House.
- Design wedding clothes for Queen Victoria or Prince Albert (He may have been wearing uniform).
- Have a go at following a Victorian recipe: brown bread ice cream, Victoria sandwich cake, kedgerree, teacakes, gruel.



Other

- Watch Newsround and summarise two stories including the headline.
- Take a walk around Keighley and take photos of Victorian buildings. Present your photos with captions (link with the last Maths activity)
- Go to Cliffe Castle Museum. Take photos, do drawings, write about what you saw there.
- Find the "Royal Arcade" in Keighley. What is hiding underneath the arcade?
