Year group: 2CM and 2ML Our theme for this half term is: Our Wonderful Community.

All of the homework options below are linked to either this theme or other learning from this term such as English / Maths / Science etc.... Pupils are expected to **read** for 15 minutes every day and practice their **phonics / spellings and times tables** every day as well in addition to choosing 1 or 2 things from the options below each week. Try to ensure you do a balance of different activities over the half term, for example Maths one week, creative the next etc...

Work (which can include photographs / evidence of activities or visits etc..) should be recorded in this Learning at Home book (unless it is a model).



English/Reading

Read a book, write three retrieval questions about it and ask a family member for the answer.

- Write a review about your book and talk about how you felt at different points.
- Create a fact sheet or poster about Captain Tom Moore and his life
- Write an acrostic poem about Tom Moore. For Example:
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- Research Sir Captain Tom Moore's life using the internet or
- Write a list of questions that you would ask Tom Moore if you could have met him.

Maths

- Create a rap or a chant to learn your 2, 5 and 10 times tables.
- Practice writing your numbers to 10, 20 and 100.
 Can you spot a pattern?
- Practice writing numbers to 50 in numerals and words. (Could you do this in chalk outside?)
- Find some different items in your house to represent different 2 digit numbers, (e.g, coins, straw, lolly sticks, counters etc)



Creative

- Create a map of your local area.
- Use different materials to design a medal.
- Draw a portrait of Tom Moore.
- Draw a picture of Captain Tom Moore completing his 100 steps challenge.



Other

- Write a letter or a thank you card and send it to someone who has made a difference in your local community, this could be for a teacher, family member or neighbor.
- Set yourself a challenge e.g. 100 star jumps
- Watch Newsround and summarise the main story.
