
Year 3 Classes: 3CH & 3MI Our theme for Autumn 1 is: Marvellous Maps

All of the homework options below are linked to either this theme or other learning from this term such as English / Maths / Science etc. Pupils are expected to read for at least 20 minutes every day. They should also find some time to practice their **phonics / spellings and times tables**, in addition to choosing 1 or 2 things from the options below each week. Try to ensure a balance of different activities are completed over the half term, for example maths one week, creative the next etc. Work (which can include photographs / evidence of activities or visits etc.) should be recorded in this Learning at Home book. Feel free to bring in models or other creative projects to display in the classroom.

- Explore your local area, the street where you live, the local park, or even a trip to the shops. Describe what you can see, smell, hear and how it makes you feel.
- Write a book review. It could be your favourite book, one you have read recently, or the book in your book bag. What do you like or dislike about it? Can you summarise what happens? Who are the main characters? What do they do and why?
- Make a poster about Keighley, encouraging people to visit. What will they find in Keighley? Why should they come?

- Make up your own dance routine can you write down the steps?
