English

Find out what Victorian London was like. Create a fact page using sentences and paragraphs.

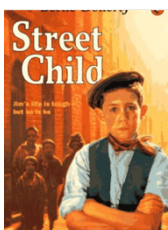
Pretend Jim Jarvis is your friend, write him a letter. What would you say to him?

Here are some of the chapters in Street Child

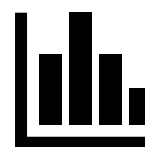
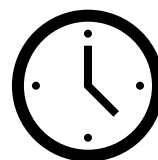

Record the ages of your family and friends. Create a tally chart or bar chart to show your findings. Do you notice anything? Summarise your findings by writing a paragraph.

Creative

Design Jim Jarvis a new waistcoat, necktie and flat cap.

Write a poem all about autumn leaves, decorate it however you like.



Create a quiz based on The Victorian era. Write ten questions and decorate your quiz.

Draw or paint a portrait of a friend or family member. Make sure you include a frame around your portrait.

Draw a squirrel holding a conker in the woods.

Draw the view from your bedroom window in the style of David Hockney.

Other

Watch one or two episodes of Newsround. What were the main headlines? Write one or two paragraphs to update Miss Fallows on what has happened in the news this week.

Go for an autumnal walk with an adult. Collect leaves, twigs, and branches. Using text and pictures, create a page in your homework book that documents your findings.

Create a sleep diary. Record the times that you go to bed and wake up each day. How would you rate your sleep quality each night? Good, Ok, Poor. Write a paragraph to summarise your sleep pattern.

Sing and dance along to your favourite song. Write about your experience in your homework book. Make sure you include the artist and title of the song.
