What will my child be learning this term?

Our theme for this term is Protect the Planet/ Pollution Solution

English 🕮

In our English lessons, we will be reading a text called 'Trash' by Andy Mulligan which discusses how trash is dumped and how people are affecting the environment. We will be learning to use formal language to write public notices, information texts and formal letters.

Another book we will be reading and exploring is the Paper Bag Prince by Colin Thompson. This book discusses the importance of nature and how humans are impacting on the environment.

Maths



In Maths, we will continue to secure our number and place value knowledge. We will be multiplying and dividing by 10, 100, 1000, learning about negative numbers and Roman numerals. Throughout the lessons, we will be working on real life problems. Our focus for this half term is to develop our confidence and fluency when adding and subtracting, multiplying and dividing. We will be using the formal written methods and learning how to apply our knowledge to real life problems. Also, we will be learning how to solve problems using long division.

How can I help my child at home?

- Ask them what they are **learning about** in school.
- Make sure they have **equipment** to do their **learning at home.**
- Check your child is doing their learning at home and handing it in on THURSDAYS!
- Listen to your child read every night and talk to them about the book (this can be done in English or the home language) use the questions in their reading records.
- Help them practice their times tables
- Help them learn their spellings.

Where can we go as a family to support my child's learning?

Talking at Home

We encourage you to talk to your child about their learning in class. Ask them what they have learnt each day or something new which they have found out. See if your child can explain what they have been learning at school. This is a good indication of how well they listen and how
