Fractions and Decimals

Our next unit is about fractions and decimals. We will continue to develop their knowledge about fractions, as we will compare, order, add and subtract fractions with the same denominator. We will then find fractions of amounts and use this to solve problems. Our unit decimals, will introduce children to dividing two-digit numbers by 10 and 100. Recognise and round decimals with up to two decimal places.

Multiplication and Division

We will continue to develop our fluency of the multiplication and division facts. We will practise them in different order and with a different game. Children all have their TTRockstars logins, so they can practise at home.

How can I help my child at home?

- Ask them what they are learning about in school.
- Make sure they have **equipment** to do their **learning at home**.
- Check your child is doing their learning at home and handing it in on THURSDAYS!
- Listen to your child read every night and talk to them about the book (this can be done in English or the home language) – use the questions in their reading records.
- Help them practice their times tables
- Help them learn their spellings.


Talking at Home


